Summer camp participants at Camp Rotary will be representing Troop 755, the Boy Scouts of America, and their families. Everyone can best enjoy summer camp when all participants step up to their responsibilities and behave with respect to others. The Boy Scout Oath and Law are the overall guidelines for the conduct at summer camp. In addition, the following Code of Conduct provides specific guidance.

All adult and youth participants are asked to agree to the Code of Conduct as a condition of participation. Violations of the code of conduct may result in removal from Camp Rotary. In this event, parents are responsible to arrange return transportation at their expense.

- 1) The Boy Scout Oath and Law are the overall guidelines.
- 2) All Camp Rotary & Troop 755 rules will be followed at all times. This includes:
  - a) Hazing or harassment is not allowed.
  - b) Alcohol, tobacco, firearms, fireworks, gambling and illegal drugs are prohibited.
  - c) Pocketknives appropriate for camping are allowed. Other knives or weapons may not be brought.
  - d) No flames or open fires are allowed in tents.
- 3) Uniforms & personal dress
  - a) Complete Class-A uniforms will be required for dinner every evening and some camp-wide events.
  - b) Other clothing may be worn at appropriate times. However, clothing must be neat and presentable, and may not display messages for alcohol, tobacco, drugs, violent behavior, or other illicit activity.
- 4) Leadership and Problem Solving
  - a) We will employ the Boy Scouts of America leadership principles; patrol leaders and/or senior patrol leaders will lead the Scouts. The Scouts, in turn, will be responsible for following their leaders.
  - b) Scouts should try to resolve problems themselves using common sense and cooperation.
  - c) Bring unresolved problems to your patrol leader or the senior patrol leader.

Ultimately, the adult leaders at camp have the responsibility for maintaining discipline and safety. They will make the final determinations regarding violations of the code of conduct and consequences.
